About Makassed

Makassed Philanthropic Islamic Association of Beirut was founded in 1878 to provideservices within three main sectors: health, education and social affairs. In line with its core beliefs, services cater to all individuals on Lebanese grounds regardless of their gender, religion, age or nationality.

It offers academic excellence to children and young people, secures preventive and curative healthcare aids and, through specific projects addressing the community's needs, supports women, elderly and refugees. The Association runs a University in Beirut with three faculties, 13 schools and a vocational and technical training center. Makassed also runs a General Hospital, four primary healthcare centers and three health mobile units that cater to the medical needs of individuals across Lebanon. In 2014, Makassed set up Ward El Makassed Center to empower underprivileged

women and youth with much needed skills through accelerated vocational trainings. Makassed outreach programs continue to expand in new fields to embrace a new generation of community players. The Volunteers Unit and the Scouts Association constantly promote a strong civic engagement and encourage those who devote their time to serving others. Makassed Religious Affairs Unit oversees activities carried out by the six Makassed mosques and centers. It monitors the religious programs of the Association and promotes activities in line with the funding mission and policies of Makassed. It is committed to preserving Muslim doctrine, principles and values, emphasizing and promoting the essence of Islam far from any extremist beliefs by organizing religious events and lectures. It also manages the two Muslim cemeteries in Beirut (Bachoura and Chouhada), including their community halls.

Makassed was established on a culture of tolerance, justice, humility and patriotism, so that citizens take pride in their values and identity while remaining open to the world and its cultural diversity.


Vision

Today its activities span from hospital and health care services, to kindergarten, vocational centers, schools and universities and also social empowerment to the most vulnerable.

Fundraising and Development Department

Established in 2016, the Fundraising and Development Department at Makassed identifies the gaps and needs of all Makassed sectors, the needs of the Association and the various funding channels for current and future projects. It also monitors the posting of new projects funded by private companies, endowment funds, donor organizations and individuals.

It has successfully established numerous partnerships to find donation sources and tracks potential funds from international organizations, private establishments and individual initiatives whether in Lebanon or abroad to expand its activities.

It aims to diversify the sources of funding in Lebanon (governmental and non-governmental institutions, individuals, banks and voluntary funds), and oversees (Arab and foreign countries, international donors and funds).

Objectives

- Capital and operational expenditures in the Education, Healthcare and social sectors;


Budget


Also It runs a General Hospital, four clinics and three mobile units.



University

Makassed University offers its students a quality learning environment in different fields, keeping pace with modern developments and committing to scientific research.

The University academic standards meet the necessary requirements and the aspirations of its affiliated students. It is made of three faculties: Islamic Studies, Nursing and Health Sciences, and the newly established Teachers Training Faculty.

Nursing and Health Sciences

Established in 1948, the College of Nursing and Health Sciences is one of the oldest nursing schools in Lebanon and the MENA region.

Makassed embraced the school under its umbrella, continued developing it, and upgraded into the "Makassed Higher Institute for Nursing" in 1986, to offer the Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing and Medical Laboratory Technology.

In 2006, the "Makassed Higher Institute for Nursing" became the "College of Nursing and Health Sciences," offering in addition to Nursing, Medical Laboratory, Respiratory Therapy (RT) and Medical Radiation Technology (MRT).

The Master's in Nursing Degree was licensed in 2013.

The College was established in 1982 to offer a Master of Arts degree in Islamic Studies and houses a rich library.

It has a distinguished elite of professors and a library specialized in Islamic heritage, considered one of the richest libraries in Lebanon in this field with a collection of 100,000 books and 508 original manuscripts.

Understanding, tolerance, and acceptance are essential values to graduate students, researchers and advocates of citizenship based on the tolerant concepts of Islam.



Teachers Training Faculty

The Teaching Diploma degree was established in 2021-2022, taking into account the recent accelerating advances in the field of education.

Students study in Arabic, English, French, in the fields of early childhood education, mathematics, sciences, chemistry, physics, philosophy and psychology, history, geography, social studies and economics.



Schools

Makassed mission and activities have expanded over the decades but its initial commitment to education remains central to its work.

Nowadays, 13 primary, elementary, middle and secondary schools educate more than 8,000 students from Akkar (North Lebanon) to the South, and from Beirut to the Beqaa. Makassed schools are committed to provide subsidized education in elementary schools and have recently included a comprehensive unit to provide for children with learning difficulties and special need.

- Wrapping up the first part of revamping Marj School 26,230 USD.








Scholarship Fund

Makassed established the Scholarship Fund Unit to reduce the phenomenon of school dropouts, in an effort to support parents unable to pay the tuition fees of their children due to the unprecedented economic crisis in Lebanon, considered to be the worst of its history. The Fundraising and Development Unit supported the 2020-2021 tuition fees of students unable to meet their school balances, with scholarships distributed to 4,592 students at Makassed schools and colleges in Beirut and remote areas for an amount of 6.9 billion Lebanese pounds. In addition, it closed last year's balances of students for an amount of 1.4 billion Lebanese pounds, which indicates that the growth factor for financial aid for current students is equal to 2.45%. The gross total of financial aid reached 8,433,397,634 LBP, with 8,326,398,531 LBP for the academic year 2020-2021 and 106,999,103 LBP for the academic year 2021-2022.


Financial aid per source in LBP






Financial aid per area




Financial aid in North Lebanon




Financial Aid in Beirut

Makassed General Hospital

Since its foundation in 1930 in Beirut, Makassed General Hospital (MGH) provides patients with high-quality and affordable services for all kinds of illnesses, diseases or injuries.

It started as a modest two-storey building with 13 doctors and 10 nurses. In 1949, the hospital building expanded to five floors and set on its course to become the general hospital it is today. Today, MGH continues its strong legacy and has grown in size, scope and reputation, offering a full range of inpatient, outpatient and emergency medical services.

MGH has also developed into a major teaching hospital, offering postdoctoral medical and fellowship training programs for physicians through its affiliations with the American University of Beirut (AUB), Beirut Arab University (BAU), the Regional University Hospital Center, as well as Lille University in France.

With the hospital's focus on keeping pace with clinical research, which has become an integral part of clinical and hospital activities.

Respecting the principle of separation of powers, each hospital department is an organizational element of the medical administration; qualified physicians ensure, in each department, that the vision of the General Hospital is implemented in their daily practice. Makassed General Hospital annually requests from physicians to provide sufficient Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits.

The goal of providing adequate patient care remains a priority for all medical and paramedical staff.



COVID-19 Unit

The first case of COVID-19 was detected in Lebanon in February 2020 and Makassed quickly set up in April 2020 a sealed off and dedicated unit to address the pandemic on a national scale.

Makassed General Hospital was among the first hospitals to obtain accreditation in May 2020 from the Ministry of Public Health to conduct COVID-19 testing in its laboratories and PCR tests.





COVID-19 Vaccination Center

Makassed launched its vaccination campaign on February 17,2021 through the Ministry of Public Health platform. The workforce included pharmacists, nurses, medical staff, Makassed Volunteers and Scouts, students from the Arab University and security agents. The center also provides a meaningful explanation of post-vaccination, through flyers, TV ads and slide shows, as well as individual awareness, during the observation period.

Makassed HealthCare Bureau (MHCB)

The Makassed Healthcare Bureau (MHCB) was established in 1983 to monitor public health and provide health assistance to the Lebanese community. It expanded to include affiliated primary health care centers.

The office recently developed new relationships with the public and private sectors locally and with internationally when there was a need to expand the scope of its work geographically and enhance its services further.

MHCB oversees four Primary Healthcare Centers (PHCCs) across Lebanon, including three Mobile Medical Units (MMUs) in populated and/or remote areas in Beirut, the Beqaa Valley, Akkar and Mount Lebanon.

MHCB provided its services and programs proficiently and at a cost-effective value, despite the staggering economic crisis, political instability and social conflicts as it was able to provide 11,143 services to a total of 22,735 beneficiaries.




Total Donations for the financial year 2020-2021

Ward El Makassed Center

In 2014, Makassed set up Ward El Makassed, one of the first community development center of its kind in Beirut's impoverished neighborhood of Tarik Al-Jadideh- a densely populated area in Beirut regarded as an important stronghold for the low-income and middle-class amongst the Beiruti community, attracting also large numbers of Syrian and Palestinian refugees.
